COURSE OUTLINE: In this class, each week participants will be assigned a short story to read outside of class. Additionally, we will focus on the fundamental elements of crafting a strong short story, such as plot structure, dialogue, pacing, and style. By analyzing various examples, students will gain a deeper understanding of what makes a compelling short story and learn how to apply these concepts in their own writing. In this class, we will delve into the intricacies of two major government systems—the presidential and parliamentary systems—by analyzing their structure, functions, and implications for governance. Through case studies of the United States and the United Kingdom, we will explore how each system operates in practice. Special attention will be given to the Indian government, which follows the parliamentary system modeled after the UK's, and we will examine the unique political environment in India. Additionally, we will explore how the political systems in Asia, Europe, and the U.S. shape international relations and domestic policies. Expect a thorough, engaging discussion with opportunities to relate these concepts to current global political events.

COURSE OUTLINE:

Philosophy explores issues that have puzzled people since the beginning of recorded thought (and possibly earlier that that). This is so for two reasons. (1) The issues explored underly our understanding of ourselves and our existence. (2) They are not issues that can be resolved once and for all.

This course will provide background on some of the listed issues and participants will discuss case studies based on these issues. Regardless of whether you took a philosophy course (most likely many years ago) or not, if you have thought about or are interested in thinking about them, this class is an opportunity to do so.

The course will focus on the following topics:

Week 1: What is philosophy?

Week 2: Many of the choices we make feel free to us. Do we have free will?

- Week 3: Some of the things we do we believe are right while others believe they are wrong. Are they only right for me or are they right for everyone?
- **Week 4:** We say we know some things and just believe others. Can we be sure that the things we say we know are actually true?

The instructor will provide you with background and a structure to discuss these issues with others.

This course will introduce the basic Spanish language and the culture of the Spanish-speaking world. This course requires no previous knowledge with the language, the lessons being the building blocks of Spanish: the alphabet, the proper pronunciation of consonant and vowel sounds, greeting and responses to greetings. You will be introduced to daily expressions found in everyday conversations. The purpose of this course is to develop basic language skills so that you can communicate appropriately in the language. Other topics covered include: Cognates, what's the weather like, describing people, family life, -AR verbs (most common), what I like and how do I feel.

A minimum of 5 participants is required to hold this class. Attendance is essential to master the information provided.

COURSE OUTLINE:

May 9th: Until the 1980's US Immigration law was largely a matter for the states. Today is almost entirely federal. Several agencies have roles in administering the INA. September 11, 2001, led to a radical restructuring of the government agencies passing the Homeland Security Act of 2002 which created the Department of Homeland Security. Nowhere does the Constitution expressly authorize the federal government to regulate immigration. I will share a brief history of the laws and discuss the agencies involved currently and their responsibilities.

Vocabulary to be discussed: INS, DHS, USCIS, EOIR, CBP, ICE, BIA, NVC (State Department), DOJ, DOL, Alien, NTA, FOIA

May 16th: Processes and Applications. Immigrant and Non-immigrant visas. Descriptions and requirements. Asylum, DACA, Family sponsored, Waivers, U/T visas, Naturalization (and Citizenship Test) Removals, BARS, Cancellation of Deportation, Work permits, Tourist and Study visas, Fiancé visa, TPS, I-94, 9 Verify, RFE's, Affidavit of Support, Biometrics.
